## LIVE-LECTURE CLASS POLICIES & PROCEDURES

All of Slater Insurance School's live-lecture weekday & weekend classes start at 8am and end at approximately 5pm. Sometimes homework assignments are given to complete at home and review the next day in class.



For each insurance line, the state law requires that you study for 20 hours:

~Life/State Laws class OR Disability (Health)/State Laws class = 20 hours of study = 2-day Slater class.

~Life, Disability (Health) & State Laws = 40 hours of study = 4-day Slater class.

~Property, Casualty & State Laws = 40 hours of study = 4-day Slater class.

~Personal Lines (Property, Casualty & State Laws, non-commercial) = 20 hours of study = 2-day Slater class.

Any student can audit (re-sit through) his/her class within six months of the original class date for free.



We provide coffee, tea and cookies free of charge. We have a break room that has a snack machine and a beverage vending machine. There is a 50 minute lunch break and several smaller breaks throughout each class day.



You are allowed to call and register for your state exam once you start your class with us. We will give you the appropriate code numbers you need on your first day of class so you can call to register and pay for your state exam with Pearson VUE testing company. **Refund & Cancellation Policy:** There is a cancellation fee of \$25 if you cancel in advance of the start date of your scheduled class. No refunds will be issued after class starts. For example, Life and Disability classes are usually paid for and taught together but are considered separate lines of insurance. If you pay and sign up for both classes and only attend one class, you are eligible for a partial refund for that one line of insurance you don't attend. The partial refund is based on the cost of one line of insurance plus a \$25 cancellation fee.
